RDP nearly caused havoc at Outapi in Omusati Region last weekend when their supporters, bussed in from other regions, parked at SWAPO Party Office at Outapi, chanting RDP slogans and hurling insults at President Hifikepunye Pohamba and Founding President Sam Nujoma.

The RDP convoy to Outapi started at Oshikango, where RDP members started calling one another on cell-phones, telling one another that they should not leave their guns behind, alleging that they had police officers who were working with them at Outapi and should "not worry."

Their weapons however were confiscated by the Police at Outapi. Another RDP convoy from Tsandi to Outapi was searched at a road block but one RDP leader told police officers that RDP central committee members' cars should not be searched. Police officers at the road block obliged, and the convoy proceeded, only to be found with weapons later at a police checkpoint some meters before the venue where RDP had a meeting.

The meeting was only attended by RDP members who were bussed in from other regions. Some of the cars had occupants carrying both RDP and SWAPO Party flags, an incidence which police said was meant to deflect identity.

"Just come your own self," said one SWAPO supporter at Outapi. "Do not carry flags of different political parties. These people are looking for trouble. They are very provocative. Now I understand why they will be soundly defeated in this month's elections."
