Community" project which would support countries to achieve the targets set by world leaders at the Wold Summit on the Information Society, WSIS, to connect all schools – primary, secondary and tertiary — to the internet by 2015.

ICTs are vital to confronting one of the biggest problems we face as a planet – the threat to climate change."

A notable presence of the youth from all over the world was very overwhelming, with many of them exchanging views with world lead-

ers and ICT executives on potential job opportunities that ICT brings along with.

A World Bank report which was released during the forum highlighted some of the opportunities that lay ahead for the youth, and how high speed internet has become key to economic growth and job creation in developing countries. It says access to affordable, high quality internet and mobile phone services enables development across all levels of the economy and society.

The report, titled "Information and Communications for Development 2009: Extending Reach and Increasing Impact" finds that for every 10 percentage-point increase in high speed internet connections, there is an increase in economic growth of 1,3 percentage points.

"Internet users in developing countries increased tenfold from 2000 to 2007, and there are now over four billion mobile phone subscribers in developing countries," it says. "The technologies offer tremendous opportunities. Governments can work with the private sector to accelerate rollout of broadband networks, and to extend access to low income consumers."

The Forum's recommendations and the way forward would be finalized today. There were more than 10 sessions during the forum, with participants choosing topics of their interest and deciding on which one to attend.
